Master Conservationists are individuals that share an interest in the sustainability of Iowa's natural resources and in becoming better stewards of those resources.

The hybrid online and in-person curriculum is developed to equip Iowans interested in natural resource conservation with the knowledge and skills necessary to make informed decisions about natural resources and to become local leaders and educators.

The Master Conservationist curriculum is structured into four online modules (seven sessions) that combine information presented and curated by Iowa State University educators with in-person sessions led by local experts.
